You can find out at SOVEREIGN Courier! During your training as a courier, express and postal services specialist, or KEP merchant for short, you will acquire key skills and knowledge for the future-oriented world of logistics.

SOVEREIGN Courier is the German partner of the global express, postage and logistics service provider, Aramex. We work with many well-known partners such as FedEx, DHL, UPS and DPD. As many shipments are received or dispatched via the Aramex network, for example, from the Near and Middle East, you will be in close contact with the SOVEREIGN customs department. You will ensure that the necessary documentation is obtained and that deadlines are met.

At SOVEREIGN Courier, you will also become familiar with import and export procedures, accounting and the large storage facility at Frankfurt Airport, where the majority of shipments arrive and from where they are flown out to their destination countries. Here you will also gain an insight into logistics services such as fulfilment, storage and packaging. You should be outgoing and enjoy dealing with other people. You will have close contact with the shipment consignors and consignees and be responsible for status and pricing information, as well as problem-solving. Address clarification is also an important part of your everyday work as you will help to ensure that important consignments actually reach their recipients.
