FOR FREIGHT FORWARD AND LOGISTICS SALESPERSON

Forwarding merchants are also referred to as the architects of transportation. They have an overall view of the most diverse shipments, vehicles and customer requests.

At SOVEREIGN, you can also learn the skills required to be a transport architect. As a member of an established team with friendly, helpful colleagues, you will learn how to arrange and check collections and deliveries, how to engage on the telephone with customers and drivers, how to book orders, coordinate trips and generate prices. The entry and maintenance of data and documents is an important task, with which you will be entrusted from an early stage.
